Anne Brunila

Executive Vice President, D.Sc.

Anne Brunila is the Executive Vice President at Fortum Corporations and responsible of Corporate Relations and Sustainability since 2009. She has served as the President and CEO of Finnish Forest Industries Federation and has had several positions at the Ministry of Finance, at The Bank of Finland and at European Commission.

She is currently also Member of the Boards of Kone Oyj, Sampo Oyj, Aalto University Foundation, The Research Institute of Finnish Economy ETLA, Finnish Business and Policy Forum EVA and Economic Information Office. Member of State ownership steering group, Member of Confederation of European Paper Industries CEPI, Member of the extended executive group of Confederation of Finnish Industries EK, Member of International Council of Forest and Paper Associations ICFPA, Member of the Finnish Delegation of International Chamber of Commerce, Member of the high-level working group for forest sector and Chairman of the working group for investments of the Finnish-Russian Intergovernmental Commission for Economic Cooperation and a Member of the Advisory Council of the Finnish Innovation Fund Sitra.



Richard Aspinall

Chief Executive, Professor

Prof. Richard Aspinall is Chief Executive of the Macaulay Land Use Research Institute. He has been Director of the Geography and Regional Science Program at the U.S. National Science Foundation, Professor of Geography at Arizona State University, Professor in the Department of Earth Sciences and Director of the Geographic Information and Analysis Centre at Montana State University.

His research is focused on land use change at the interface of coupled natural and human systems, sustainable development, GIS, environmental modelling, and environmental geography. He has participated in many EU and US research projects. He is editor of the Journal of Land Use Science, editor of the environmental sciences section of the Annals of the Association of American Geographers, and a member of the international Science Steering Committee of the IHDP/IGBP Global Land Project, as well as the UK Committee for the International Human Dimensions Programme.



Peter Nijkamp

Professor, Ph.D.

Prof. Peter Nijkamp is a professor of Regional, Urban and Environmental Economics at the Free University, Amsterdam. He has been heavily involved in environmental research and environmental economics, both theoretically and empirically. His main research interests cover plan evaluation, multicriteria analysis, regional and urban planning, transport systems analysis, mathematical modelling, technological innovation, and resource management. In the past years he has focused his research in particular on quantitative methods for policy analysis, as well as on behavioural analysis of economic agents.

He has a broad expertise in the area of public policy, services planning, infrastructure management and environmental protection. In all these fields he has published many books and numerous articles. He is member of editorial boards of more than 20 journals. He has been visiting professor in many universities all over the world. He is past president of the European Regional Science Association and of the Regional Science Association International. He is also fellow of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Sciences, and is immediate past vice-president of this organisation. Since June 2002 he serves as president of the governing board of the Netherlands Research Council (NWO).



Alan Warde

Co-Director, Professor

Prof. Alan Warde is a professor of Sociology at University of Manchester and Co-Director of the ESRC Centre for Research on Innovation and Competition (CRIC). CRIC's research projects have included the development of consumer theories with particular emphasis on food and economic sociology. Alan Warde is currently also a professor of the Jane and Aatos Erkkö Foundation, and addresses sustainable consumption at Helsinki Collegium of Advanced Studies. The Erkkö professorship is intended in particular for research into social justice and the future of the welfare society.

Prof Warde's current substantive work is concerned with: sustainable consumption; the sociology of consumption, especially the changing patterns of cultural consumption and the emergence of consumer culture in Europe; cultural omnivorousness; the sociology of food, particularly change in habits; consumer politics; social capital and political participation; social networks and their role in class formation and cultural consumption; social class analysis; professions; time-use; the market research industry; the analysis of social change; social and cultural elites in Europe.

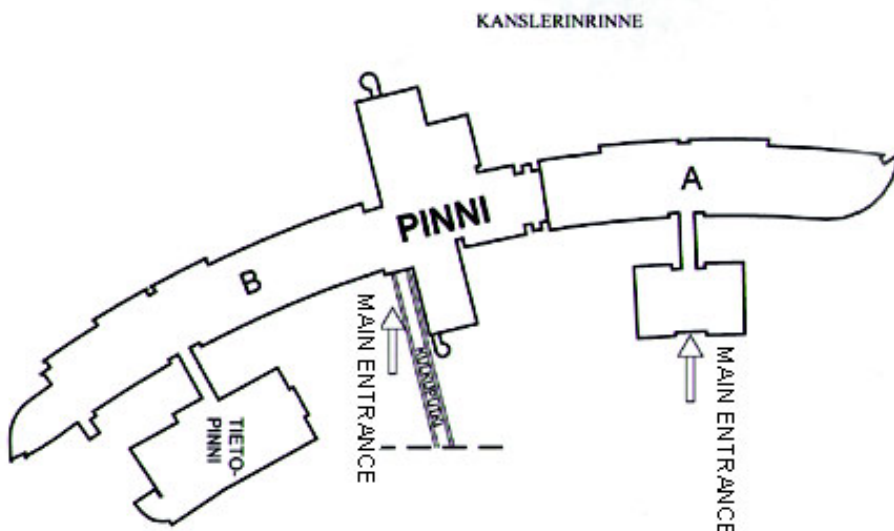

GENERAL INFORMATION

Conference Venue. The conference will be held at the University of Tampere, in building Pinni B (Address: Kanslerinrinne 1).

Information Desk. The information desk is located near the main entrance of the building Pinni B. Conference staff and TAVI Congress Bureau are present at the information desk during the whole event. Information about the city of Tampere, Finland, Internet, etc. can be found at the information desk, that is open on Thursday 8.30-17.00 and Friday 8.30-16.30.

Registration. Holiday Inn Hotel (address: Yliopistonkatu 44) on Wednesday at 17.00-19.00. University of Tampere, Information Desk, see above.

Badges. Please wear your official conference badge at all times. Your badge must be visible to enter all conference sessions and the social programme.

Lunch and coffee. Lunch will be served daily at the University restaurant Minerva, 2nd floor. Coffee will be served in the lobby (1st floor) on Thursday and at the Minerva on Friday.

Lecture rooms. The opening ceremony, keynote speeches and panel discussion are held on the first floor in the auditorium B1100, close to the entrance. Each workshop has its own lecture room on the 3rd or 4th floor. The first number of the lecture room stands for the floor (e.g. B3109 is on the third floor, B4115 on the fourth).

Water. Finnish tap water is of the highest quality and can be consumed safely throughout the country.

Internet. Temporary guest accounts to connect a personal computer to the Tampere University Public Access Network (UTAPAC) are available at the conference registration desk.

Smoking. Smoking is prohibited indoors in public places. Conference venue Pinni B has designated areas for smoking outside the main doors.

Taxis. Taxi fares throughout Finland are comparable to those in continental Europe. The meter is switched on as the customer steps into the vehicle. At the start of the journey, the meter displays a fixed basic charge. In daytime, a five-kilometre journey costs about 15€ and a ten-kilometre ride 20€. The telephone number for ordering taxis is 0100 4131 (from a mobile phone). Night-time fares include a surcharge.
